Service Committees and Membership Activities

Awards: Researches and promotes award opportunities available through Garden Club Federation of Massachusetts for Club projects.

Civic Beautification: Provides for the long-term beautification of visible public areas in Harvard and participates in seasonal plantings and summer watering.

Garden Therapy: Works with selected groups of elders, using plant materials and garden projects as therapy.

Garden Tour: Organizes a tour of local gardens to visit after our annual meeting in June.

Graduation Flowers: Provides floral decorations for Bromfield graduation ceremonies.

Greens Workshop: In December, collects greens and provides holiday arrangements for the homebound.

Library/Meeting Flowers: Supplies arrangements or plants for Library, September through May. On the week of our monthly regular meeting, the arrangement will be brought first to St Theresa's and then transferred to the library.

Meeting Programs: Planning programs for our regular monthly meetings from September to April.

Nature Trails/Conservation: Participates in nature walks to identify flora and helps maintain conservation trails.

Publicity: Produces and coordinates publicity in media and with public to showcase Club's activities.

Technology: Assists the club with technical issues.
